<p>English</p> <p>This term we will be learning about traditional African folklores and the continent of Africa. We will be using two books as the basis of our learning to aid comprehension and support the writing that will be produced this term.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>This term we will be covering several shorter topics. <p>Science</p> <p>This term we will be learning about teeth and digestion. This will include understanding why different animals have different shapes of teeth and how humans protect their teeth. Class 3 will also look at the digestive system – which organs it includes and how it functions.</p>		
<p>History</p> <p>We will be doing a local study on the Tudors, focusing on the skill of chronology and inference using sources.</p>	<p>PE</p> <p>This term, Class 3 will be having fitness sessions on Friday afternoons with a Progressive Sports Coach. As well as this, Class 3 will be continue to go swimming on Thursdays.</p>	<p>ICT</p> <p>We will be using Scratch programming.</p>
<p>Music</p> <p>This term we will be having weekly Ukulele lessons on Wednesday mornings.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>We will be exploring the question; ‘What kind of world did Jesus want?’ and understanding Christianity.</p>	<p>PSHE</p> <p>We will looking at the British Values, with a particular focus on tolerance and the rule of law.</p>

Homework
